Purpose of Meeting

Title I Funds

Attendance Review Committee will monitor the daily attendance bulletin, Early Warning Systems reports and the attendance dashboard and implement the School Attendance Action Plan which includes contacting parents, one on one counseling, attendance contracts and home visits as needed.

Students in the lowest 25% will be given equitable access to robust and rigorous instruction and will be provided interventions outside the core instruction through i-Ready labs, targeted morning tutorials and the ELL tutoring to ensure academic success.

Our School Achievement Data

Our school earned a total of 438 points from the Florida School accountability formula which amounts to our "A". In English Language Arts 62% of our students scored proficient. In Math 73% of our students demonstrated proficiency and in Science we had 53% of our students demonstrate proficiency. In Mathematics 67% of our students that are in the lowest 25% had learning gains and in English Language Arts 51% of our students in the lowest 25% showed learning gains. Additionally, 65% of our students demonstrated learning gains in English language Arts.

- Our school uses data to align the curriculum to State and District academic standards.
- Our instructional practices are adjusted based on the findings of the assessment data.



School-Parent Compact


School and Parent Collaboration
